Black, Asian and minority ethnic families and communities are too often on the edge of services that could offer support. When services are accessed there can be a lack of understanding of societal power and inequality leading to their voices not being heard and continued 'othering'.

Funded by The Robertson Trust for three years from 2022, <u>Scottish Attachment in Action</u> (SAIA) is embarking on co-creating with parents and community groups a series of workshops. *Co-creating just means that each workshop may differ depending on the needs and wants of the participants in each group.*

Workshops will explore:-

- To explore **Why Attachment Matters** and what would be supportive in your own lives, your families' lives and in your communities
- · What is attachment?
- · What do attachment relationships mean to you?
- · How are these relationships affected by societal power and inequality?
- How can services be influenced?

The workshops will be led by Gillian Neish and Edwina Grant who you will get to know well. Both are also Trustees of SAIA.
