Why Attachment Matters Attachment, Racism and the Impact on Relationships

A course for people from Black and Minority Ethnic communities.

People from Black and Minority Ethnic communities and their families are too often on the edge of services that could offer support. When services are accessed, there can be a lack of understanding of societal power and racism leading to their voices not being heard and continued 'othering'.

Scottish Attachment in Action (SAIA) secured funding until 2025 from the Robertson Trust to work with women and men from Black and Minority Ethnic communities to explore attachment, racism and the impact on relationships.

Courses are facilitated by Gillian Neish and Edwina Grant. Gillian is a trainer who works with individuals and organisations in all sectors to help them recognise and fulfil their potential. The focus of her work is power, whether challenging the power inequalities of racism, sexism and the other 'isms' or developing personal power through personal development programmes. Gillian is also a Trustee of SAIA. Edwina is an independent chartered educational psychologist and certified Dyadic Developmental Psychotherapy (DDP) practitioner, consultant and trainer. She works with children and families in a range of contexts from residential care to family therapy.

"We want to create a safe space where participants can learn together about attachment across the lifespan and then offer an opportunity for participants to reflect on the impact of racism on themselves, their families and in the community.



Also to support participants to find ways for their voices to be heard. We aim to build a community of people who have undertaken this training and will provide opportunities after the workshops to stay connected."
